

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS SBH 2011

These notes should be read in conjunction with British Rowing's 'Row Safe'.

COMPETITOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- All competing crews should ensure that their equipment is 'fit for purpose', paying particular attention to: bow balls, heel release mechanisms, rudder lines and buoyancy compartments/canvases. Umpires may carry out spot checks and race numbers may be withdrawn if boats do not meet the required standards.
- All boats, taking part in the event have to be registered, either in advance through the EA/British Rowing Block registration Scheme, or through purchase of a temporary registration directly from the EA. Please ensure you allow sufficient time for purchase of your boat registration. Full details of the scheme are at the the British Rowing website <http://www.britishrowing.org/boat-licences>
- All coxes **MUST** wear life jackets (or approved buoyancy aids), in accordance with British Rowing's Row Safe Code.
- All competitors must be able to swim 100 meters in rowing kit.
- All crews must have adequate Third Party insurance.

SAFETY

- All race marshals will wear fluorescent yellow tabards stating 'MARSHAL', also be in radio contact with all other race marshals, start and finish. In an emergency, the race marshal nearest to the incident will initially take charge. Racing may be stopped until the incident has been resolved. Crews that stopped racing may go back to the start. Racing will resume under the instructions of the Start Marshals.
- No racing crew is allowed to paddle up stream before the race has started.
- The organisers will make their best endeavours to provide safe racing, but this does not absolve individual competitors from exercising a duty of care for themselves, any third party and their equipment. Less experienced competitors are encouraged to have bank party attending.

COURSE

- A plan of the course is attached showing the positions of marshals. **CREWS ARE WARNED THERE IS A WEIR BELOW THE START.**

- Mobile phones will be kept at the start and finish and also at Race Control. A public phone can be found just before the Pike & Eel/Penny Ferry pub at the junction of Water Lane/Fen Rd. In the main boathouse area there is a pay phone at 1st & 3rd Trinity boathouse.

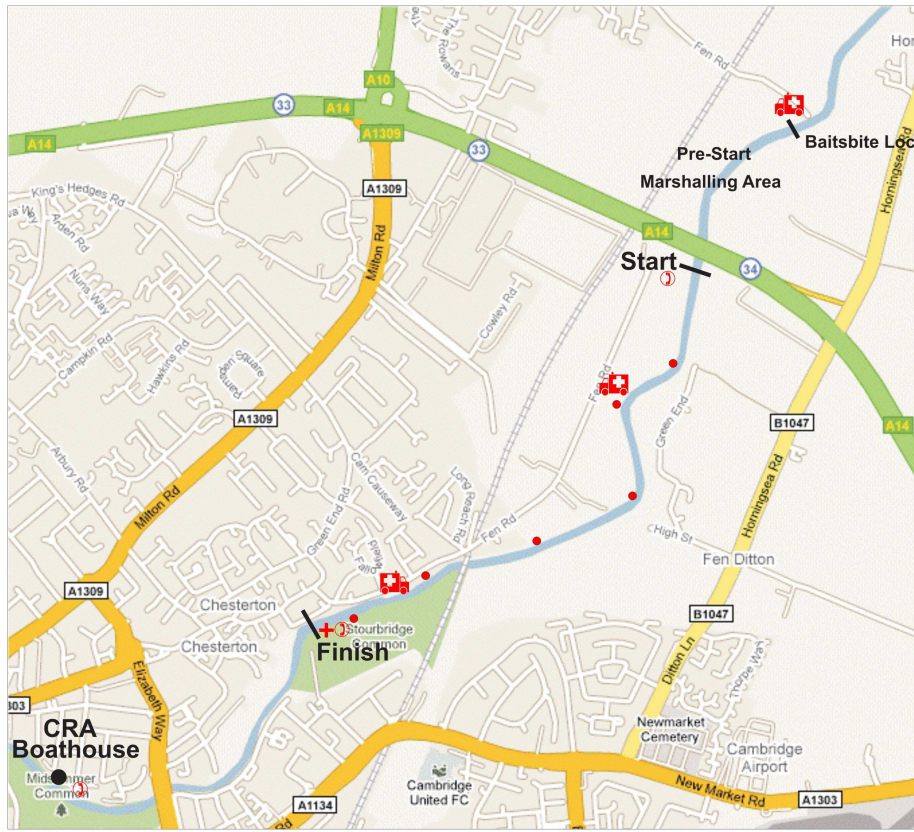
